WELCOME! To... all the new children in school especially our Nursery and Reception children, welcome also to all the new parents who have joined school this September. It is lovely to welcome you to our school family. Welcome also to Mrs Maguire who is teaching in Years 5 and 6 on Monday and Tuesday. I am sure that our school community will give everybody a warm welcome!

A SUCCESSFUL 2017-18: The initial national result data has been released for all schools and when we look at the results of St Raphael's when compared to national we have done tremendously well. The attainment results and progress results are all well above national - please see website for the detailed breakdown. In saying this, St Raphael's is much more than the sum of the results. The monitoring of lessons show that the teachers are doing an excellent job. The behaviour and manner of the children show that the culture of the school is one to be proud of. The performances have been outstanding, the York trip was really enjoyable, and the school is ready to move from strength to strength.



STAFF UPDATE: As you may know already I will be moving on to pastures new at Christmas. It has always been a great privilege to serve the children, families, staff and community of St Raphael's as Headteacher. I will go with a lot of very happy memories; however, until then, I am still here leading the school as Executive Headteacher alongside Mrs Lakner as Head of School and Mr Matthews as Assistant Headteacher. The appointment process for a new headteacher has been started by the Governing Board already and the position will be advertised in January.

SCHOOL LEADERSHIP - YEAR 6: The Year 6 children are busy applying for a leadership role in school. We will be appointing Head Girl and Boy, House Captains and Sports Captains over the next few weeks and the children have received job descriptions for each role. They are putting in a great deal of effort to explain how their skills will serve the school and we will be announcing the successful candidates on Friday 21st September in assembly. They have been told of the famous JFK quote which I paraphrase here, "Think not what St Raphael's does for you but what you can do for St Raphael's." They all have a great opportunity to contribute to school in a distinctive way and I am looking forward to seeing what innovative ideas they have.

SUMMER RAMBLE: Due to the Moorland fires in the summer we had to postpone our Summer Ramble. It will now take place on Friday 21st September. The children in EYFS and Years 1, 2 and 3 will walk around the school grounds. The children in Years 4, 5 and 6 will walk in the local area. The children may wear non-uniform for this day however, please ensure that they have suitable footwear and a waterproof jacket or coat.



50 YEAR ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS 1968-2018: St Raphael's School celebrates its 50th anniversary during the 2018-19 academic year. We will have displays of photographs and memorabilia around the school and we are inviting our wider school community to contribute to this. If you or your family have anything they would like to share it would be much appreciated; this could be photographs, school reports, pictures of memorable events etc. Please get in touch!

50 YEARS IN ONE DAY: As part of the anniversary celebrations on Friday 28th September the children are invited to come to school in non-uniform dressed in an outfit linked to one of the decades from the last 50 years. The children will be doing some work on the decades in school. There will also be a theatre performance in the afternoon as part of the celebrations.

ST RAPHAEL'S DAY MASS: This year our anniversary Mass will be celebrated slightly later than usual on Friday 5th October as Bishop Mark Davies will be joining us and leading the Mass for our anniversary year. This is a very special day for the school. On this day we will have a whole school Mass when all the Reception children will be presented by their Year 6 buddies. We will also formally welcome all new children and staff into our community. This will be followed by a coffee morning for parents arranged by the children in aid of Macmillan Cancer Care. There will also be a cake sale for the children at break time (please send no more than £1.00 in with your child). Please note this day is not a non-uniform day and all children must be in their correct winter uniform.



MACMILLAN COFFEE MORNING: As mentioned above we will be having a coffee morning and cake sale as part of the National Macmillan Coffee Morning, organised by Miss Taylor and Mrs Taylor!. This is a cause close to all our hearts and the money raised ensures that cancer patients have the Macmillan team in their corner; from diagnosis, through treatment, and afterwards. Miss Taylor will be sending home a letter later this month with further details.

FRIENDS OF ST RAPHAEL'S MEETING: Thank you to everyone who worked so hard last year to raise funds for school and to organize social events for our community. We raised nearly £2,500 to support the enrichment activities we provide over the course of the academic year. This year the first meeting will be Thursday 27th September at 6.00pm in school. Please come along and share ideas for this new academic year - everyone is welcome.

CAFOD ASSEMBLY: Year 6 will be leading our CAFOD Harvest Assembly on Friday 19th October at 9.15am. We will be collecting tins and dry foods throughout that week which will then be distributed to Local Foodbanks. Thank you in anticipation of your help with this.



PASSING ON MESSAGES & RAISING CONCERNS: May I politely remind parents that in the morning Miss Southworth is the first port of call for any enquiries resolve most of your concerns very quickly. The class teachers are busy preparing for the teaching day ahead and therefore may not be available at this time. If you do need to speak to a teacher, please try to catch them at the end of the day, or if this is inconvenient, contact Miss Southworth or the office who will be able to arrange suitable a time for this.

Most issues can be resolved by a short conversation; however, if you wish to raise a formal concern there is a set procedure in place. Therefore, if you are in this situation, please refer to the School's Concerns & Complaint Policy and Unreasonable Complaints Policy for guidance, these are available on the school website. These are here to give parents and schools an agreed structure with which to work through. As stated previously, most concerns can be dealt with swiftly and efficiently through a meeting; however if you do wish to write to school about a matter, please be advised that you will receive a written reply within five working days and this letter will invite you in to school to have a meeting where the matter can be resolved.

ATTENDANCE: Thank you for your support last year, the whole school attendance figure of 96.16% was good! Thank you also to Miss Southworth and Mrs Heywood who work hard to make sure that all children are in school each day. This year's attendance target for the whole school is 97%. We will continue to report monthly attendance figures in the newsletter and talk about attendance in our Friday morning praise assembly... our attendance bears will be back!

In addition, each term children with 100% attendance for the duration of that term will have a Movie afternoon. Each new term starts fresh therefore there are three opportunities in the year for your child to be rewarded for 100% attendance. At the end of the year children with 100% attendance will receive an attendance badge.

We monitor attendance closely and check registers each day for absences following up where necessary. We ask that any appointments be made outside school hours or where this isn't possible after morning or afternoon registration allowing your child to receive their mark in the registers. If your child is off due to an appointment this is classed as an authorised medical absence but will still affect their attendance.

If your child is sick you must notify school before 9.30am to ensure we have the information to mark in the registers. If your child is off due to sickness or diarrhea they must remain off school for 48 hours after the last occurrence, as outlined by the Health Protection Agency. We are aware that children may have specific illnesses that prevent them from attending school and this could have bring your child's attendance level down.

ABSENCES IN TERM TIME: Since 2012 being absent from school in term time for any reason other than illness is not allowed by law and the local authority work with schools to fine parents who do so. Therefore, the Governing Board are unable to give permission for term time absences, this includes holidays, family occasions etc. In exceptional circumstances, requests for absence will be further considered and may be authorised. Below is the legal notice I give each year to enable us to fine if needed. Please take note of the advice given. Attendance at school has direct impact on children's life chances and we are duty bound to make decisions in the best interests of children.

Any requests for leave of absence need to be made using the form available from the school office and any decision is made by the Governing Board. The Governing Board will make a further review of procedures over this term however as a school we need to report any absences which fit the below criteria to the LA.

**THIS IS THE OFFICIAL NOTICE THAT WE ARE REQUIRED BY LAW TO SEND OUT BY THE LA
Penalty Notices for Non- school attendance - Information Letter**

Section 444(A) of the Education Act 1996 empowers the local authority to issue Penalty Notices in cases of unauthorised absence from school. This means that when a pupil has unauthorised absence of 10 sessions (5 days) or more, in any term (where no acceptable reason has been given for the absence) or if their child persistently arrives late for school after the close of registration, their parents or carers may receive a Penalty Notice of £120, which is reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days. The penalty notice will need to be paid in full before 28 days of the notice being served. Failure to pay a penalty notice may result in prosecution.

In law, an offence is committed if a parent or carer fails to secure a child's regular attendance at school. Tameside Education Welfare Service, in conjunction with schools and Greater Manchester Police, will use these powers as an early deterrent to prevent patterns of unauthorised absence developing.

Parents may also receive a Penalty Notice without a warning letter for the offence of failing to secure regular school attendance under the following circumstances:

- *Their child is stopped on a truancy sweep more than once*
- *They go on holiday in term time without school's permission*
- *The child fails to return to school following a fixed term exclusion*

The Education and Inspections Act 2006 also makes it an offence if a parent fails to ensure that their child is not in a public place during the first 5 days of a fixed term or permanent exclusion. Penalty Notices may be issued for such an offence. The Local Authority and schools are committed to providing the best possible future for your child. If you have concerns about your child's attendance at school or if you are experiencing any difficulties, please contact your school and ask for help.

MORNING WELCOME: Please remember that Miss Southworth will be outside - come rain or shine - each morning to answer any questions or take any messages you may have.

CONTACT DETAILS: A pupil contact form was sent home last week; please return this form as soon as possible to ensure we have the most accurate details for your child. A copy can also be printed from the school website. Due to the new government guidelines- Keeping Children Safe in Education 2018- by law we require 2 contact details for each child.

ASTHMA REGISTER: At the start of this new school year we will be checking all asthma boxes in school, if your child has an inhaler and one needs to be kept in school please contact the office to complete a school asthma card. A copy of school's asthma Policy is available on the website.

ATTENDANCE: Remember every day in school is important. The termly 100% attendance prize started from 05.09.2018!

SAFEGUARDING: At St Raphael's we have robust systems to ensure that we safeguard our children. Part of this is to ensure that parents have details of who to contact in school with any questions regarding child protection. Below is the list of people to speak to and their role within school.

SAFE DROP OFF/COLLECTION OF CHILDREN: School has a breakfast club which opens at 8.30am at a cost of 50p per day. Funtasia Kids Club is also based on site in the Parish Hall offering before and after school child care. Alternatively, children are supervised from 8.45am on the playground, children dropped off before this time remain your responsibility until staff are outside on duty at 8.45am. Please ensure that your new class teacher knows the collection arrangements for your children. For safeguarding purposes, we cannot hand children over to adults we do not know.

SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDERS: The children are expected to wear the following uniform until Easter 2019;

Uniform

- Grey Skirt / Pinafore / Trousers.
- Y1-Y6 - Plain Blue Shirt.
- Y1-Y6 - Blue and Yellow Tie - Rip Tape / Clip or Traditional.
- EYFS - Plain Blue Polo Shirt / School Branded Polo Shirt.
- School Branded Blue Jumper / Cardigan / Sweatshirt.

Footwear

- Sensible, black footwear only.
- Boots / Trainers / Heels are not allowed.

Please ensure all uniform has your child's name clearly marked on, either in indelible pen or with an iron/sew on name label.

Lunch Bags: Children on packed lunches are asked to bring their lunch in a separate lunch bag/box and that it is of a suitable size to be housed on the lunch box trolley. Please keep the lunches simple and nutritious.

Book Bags: All children in Years 1 to 4 are expected to use a school book bag instead of a separate school bag. If your child needs a new book or PE bag these can be purchased from the school office. Children in Year 5 and 6 may use their own suitably sized school bag.

Jewellery: Is not permitted at any time, this includes earrings as agreed by the Governing Board. Please ensure any earrings are removed before your child comes into school each day, plasters will only be permitted until the end of September. If your child comes into school with earrings after this date you will be contacted to come and remove them by the school office. Failure to remove the earrings will result in the child staying in school for playtimes and PE due to Health & Safety reasons.

Hair: Long hair should be tied up. No extreme hair-styles are allowed, eg, bleach, tram-lines, highlights, spikes etc. Finally we request that children refrain from using hair products.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: It is important that the children in Reception to Year 6 remember their PE kits with them in school. *If the children have not got their kit a letter will be sent home by the class teacher.*

PE Kit

- Indoor - Navy Blue PE Shorts, School Branded Blue PE T-Shirt and Black Pumps.
- Outdoor - Navy Tracksuit / Sweatshirt / Jogging Bottoms, School Branded Blue PE T-shirt and Trainers.
- Children also need a PE bag which is clearly marked with their name.

HOMEWORK: EYFS Homework will be set once a week by the class teacher. The children in Year 4-6 will be given a reading comprehension or SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar) exercise and a Maths exercise every week. In Year 1-3 there is one piece of homework which alternates between English and Maths each week.

All homework is given out on Tuesday to be returned by the following Monday

If a child does not have their homework in school, or it is not completed suitably, they will be asked to complete it on Tuesday lunchtime and a letter will be sent home by the class teacher. Homework will start from Tuesday 11th September.

In addition, all children are expected to read at home each night and this should be recorded in the homework diary/reading journal. These are checked on a regular basis by the teacher. It is vital that children read to an adult who contributes directly to their child's learning by questioning them on the content of their book to develop comprehension and deduction skills.

PLAYTIME SNACKS: Children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a break time snack as part of Nursery Snack Fund and the Fruit in School initiative. Children in Year's 3-6 can choose to bring in a break time snack which should be a piece of fruit (no snacks from packets please). Children in EYFS also have milk at morning break with their fruit.

SCHOOL MEALS: Our school kitchen is now under the management of Tameside Council and Robertson's FM and will continue to deliver a freshly prepared school dinner each day for those children who wish to have a school meal. From September 2018, the price of a school meal is £2.25 per day.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal under the UIFSM programme.

Children in Nursery, Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 can have a school meal which is charged at £2.25 per day.

School meals must to be paid regularly and are payable to TMBC not the School. We recommend that parents pay online for school meals using the Tameside website at www.tameside.gov.uk/schools/meals. The advantages of using this service are that you can make a cashless payment for school meals which is instantly receipted to yourself and the school. School then log the payment against your child. If you are unable to make an online payment you may send

cash into school with your child in a clearly labelled envelope. Cheques are no longer accepted. Dinner Monies are not able to be paid using the SchoolMoney portal due to the income being receivable by TMBC and not St Raphael's.

It is your responsibility as parent/carer to ensure you are paying dinner money regularly, it is not the school's responsibility to prompt you to make payments. Please be aware that outstanding payments above £30.00 are referred to Tameside and will have to be paid to Tameside and not the school, once any debt reaches £30.00 it is automatically referred to the LA.

If your child is in Year 3-6 and you feel you meet the criteria to receive a Free School Meals please visit www.tameside.gov.uk/schools/meals for more information or speak to the school office.

PACKED LUNCH: Children may bring a packed lunch from home as an alternative to a cooked school meal, please provide a healthy balanced lunch for your child. We ask that you do not include fizzy drinks or cans, breakable containers, sweets or chocolate. Please ensure the lunch is in a lunch bag, clearly marked with name and class.

Two weeks' notice to applicable to change from school meals to sandwiches or sandwiches to school meals: this applies to all pupils in school and must be given in writing to the school office.



MEET THE TEACHER: It was great to welcome parents to the meet the teacher sessions last Wednesday evening. I do understand that some parents were unable to attend therefore if you have any questions or if you need to find out anything please contact the teacher or school.

CURRICULUM AT ST RAPHAEL'S: At the start of each half term your child's class teachers will send home the curriculum half term overview, a copy of these will also be on the website. These are coming home this week for Autumn Term 1.

MONEY INTO SCHOOL: In January 2018 we commenced the launch of SchoolMoney across the school with the aim of becoming a cashless environment from September 2018. In July 2018 every pupil at St Raphael's had been successfully integrated onto the portal and parents were making regular payments for trips, wraparound, snack fund etc. The final payment to be launched will be breakfast club which we hope to launch later this term. School Fund collections from Non-Uniform Days, Cakes sale etc will still be collected as cash.

We are currently updating the portal and ensuring all our new children are integrated and that we have the correct contact details for all parents. To ensure that we all experience maximum benefit from this service, we would ask all parents to notify us if you have recently changed your mobile number and/or email address for your main school contact (this will be the person who received school text messages).

From time to time you will receive a text message from the school inviting you to access a website as an option to make a payment for an activity. We would appreciate your support in this matter. We will not be inviting you to settle school dinner payments via this system just yet as TMBC currently have an online payment system for parents, given income is receivable by the Local Authority and not school.

Further information about the service, including user guides for both desktop and mobile devices are available on the school website.

If you are unable to access the internet at home, you can pay by card at the office or obtain a pay point barcode.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS: The list of clubs for this term came home last week - a copy can be downloaded from the website if required. Please be aware that Chess is Autumn Term 1 only. Payments for the After-School Clubs (where applicable) will be collected via SchoolMoney, any cash payments will be logged on here against your child by the school office.

SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS: Individual and Sibling School Photographs take place in School on Monday 8th October 2018. All children are to be in their Winter Uniform with children in Years 1-6 wearing a shirt and tie. If you have any siblings under School age but would to have a group photograph this will be done in the hall between 8.30am and 9.00am.



PARISH MASSES: Our regular weekly Masses in school have already commenced and will be every Thursday at 10.00am. These Masses will either be for the whole school or will be attended by one class each week. All are wider school and parish community are welcome to join us for Mass.
