

## Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium Grant spending 2012 – 2013



There were **5 pupils** in the St Raphael's Catholic Primary School 2013 cohort entitled to the Pupil Premium Grant. **Each child counts as 20%.**

The following statistics are based upon their performance at the end of KS2 compared with children receiving the Pupil Premium Grant Nationally.

### Summary

#### Attainment:

In 2013, KS2 children at St Raphael's, who received Pupil Premium funding, attained higher than those receiving the funding nationally in all writing and maths while being just above in reading when looking at the Average Point Score. The percentages of pupils to get Level 4 were well above in writing and maths and just above in reading.

#### Progress:

Of those 4 pupils, most made average or better progress in all areas. In writing and maths our results were well above expected progress. In writing we have less than one child below national comparison (9%) who did not make the expected progress.
